Dear Friends,

"Rejoice in the Lord always, again I will say, Rejoice."

Philippians 4:4

I have loved reading the joy that folks have been sharing each Sunday on the butcher paper by the butterfly door. People have been experiencing joy by:

listening to a new piece of music, having lunch with high school friends, listening to my teacher more, seeing old friends who needed cheering up, looking for squirrels and birds with a grandson, listening to my grandchild say, "You're the best Nana ever!" (after cleaning her room for her), playing UNO with granddaughter and great grandkids, talking with a childhood friend, and so many more!

Joy is everywhere! It is above us in the beauty of birds and trees and skies, it is around us in friends and family, and it is below us, too! Mary Ellen Clinard and I went out collecting rocks for a project and I kept noticing how beautiful the rocks were – earthy colors, intriguing shapes, and rich textures. Delightful joy lying at my feet!

These words I shared at the beginning of this letter are from the Apostle Paul to the church in Philippi. The verse may be familiar to you but did you know that together, the words joy and rejoice appear over 15 times in this short four-chapter book. Joy not only permeates the book of Philippians but the whole of scripture:

Leviticus says "You shall rejoice before the Lord your God." (23:40)

"Rejoice with joy and singing" Isaiah proclaims. (35:2)

The prophet Joel prompts God's people with these words: Be glad and rejoice in the Lord. (2:23)

And one of the shortest verses in the Bible is about rejoicing. "Rejoice always" (I Thessalonians 5:16)

From Genesis to Revelation, joy is everywhere and sometimes the concentration of joy is so abundant that you cannot miss it. In Luke 15, every time something lost gets found, there is a celebration. It matters not if it is a sheep, a coin, or a son, each parable ends with a party–people rejoicing over what was found. These words from Jesus accompany the parables of the lost sheep and lost coin, "Just so, I tell you, there will be joy in heaven over one sinner who repents." We are invited to be people of joy!

The joy that the Bible speaks of may be different than how we usually think of it. We tend to categorize joy as an emotion that we are either feeling or not feeling and there are certainly passages of the Bible that record this expression of joy. But more times than not, joy is a response to not only God's work in the world and God's work in us but our response to who God is. Living lives of joy is how we respond to God's mercy, grace, love and care.

I encourage you to continue to observe the great fifty days of Easter by embracing joy as you notice and respond to God's presence in the world. To help you along, I invite you to join the following:

- 1. We have been sharing joy bookmarks each Sunday of the Easter season. Follow the prompts for ways to experience joy through listening, connecting, noticing, encouraging, blessing, and sharing. If you are not able to be in worship, call the church office and we will get you your joy bookmarks!
- 2. Read the Psalms. They are full of joy! It just so happens that the Reading-of-the-Bible-in-a-year readings have us beginning the Psalms in the month of May. If you want to following along with the Psalms, the schedule I on page 6 of the newsletter.

As I opened in scripture, so I close, with words from Psalm 16:11, "In your presence there is fullness of joy; in your right hand are pleasures forevermore." I pray that you experience this truth.

Easter Isn't Over!

I am sure that many of us have experienced times when we thought "I don't want this moment to end!" Easter Worship was one of those times with the

vibrant flowers, the glorious telling of the Easter story and the pronouncement of HE IS RISEN! And let's not forget the enthusiastic singing (some with choreography!), and the excitement of the Easter Egg Hunt.

Fortunately, that Easter moment doesn't need to end. Easter is not just a Sunday, but a SEASON in the liturgical year. Easter Sunday isn't just a once a year experience, but marks the beginning of 50 days of Easter joy!

Each Sunday throughout the season, until Pentecost on May 28th, we will be taking time to think about ways to continue to keep that "Easter feeling" in our hearts and our lives. Each Sunday you will find a little something added to the sanctuary that reflects Easter joy. Did you notice the banners with the words "Christ is Risen" or "Alleluia"?
