## From the Pastor

Dear Friends,

I am so excited about our upcoming worship series – Summer Road Trip: A Journey thru Genesis. Summer is the perfect time for a road trip and it is the perfect time to journey thru Genesis. Practically nobody stays in the same place from one chapter to the next in Genesis! People are on the move, there are multiple fights between siblings, as well as detours, surprising discoveries, do-overs, new beginnings, and so much more. It sounds like a road trip, doesn't it?

There is one big difference though – sometimes we embark on a road trip like a tourist, someone who wishes to be entertained – and there is nothing wrong with that. But we don't approach our Journey thru Genesis with the mindset of a tourist, we undertake it with the mindset of a pilgrim, someone who wishes to be transformed. We encounter the Bible with the expectation that God will speak to us, call us, shape us, and move us. A tourist may have the desire to sit back and relax on a vacation, but as pilgrims we lean forward and engage, making ourselves open to be challenged and changed.

There are some worship series resources to help us keep the mindset of a pilgrim:

**Summer Road Trip Passport –** This is a way for you to track your progress as you journey. You can pick up your passport beginning on June 4<sup>th</sup> in worship or you can have the church office send you one. Each week, make sure you stop by the 'Park Ranger of the Day' to get your passport 'cancelled'.

## **A North Star Congregation**

Dear Friends,

It has been several months since I have written to you about the current state of our denomination. The dates for General Conference (the only body that can make official decisions and set policy for the United Methodist Church) are set for April 23, 2024 thru May 3, 2024. Although no official decisions have been made, you may be aware that some United Methodist churches have voted to disaffiliate from the denomination because they are concerned about our denomination moving toward inclusivity.

You may be wondering, "What about us?" Whenever someone has asked me if we are going to take a vote, I ask them if they want us to leave the denomination. Nobody has ever expressed to me a desire to leave, all the people who have asked me about voting are insistent on wanting to stay United Methodists. We do not need to vote to remain what we already have declared ourselves to be.

Nevertheless, this is a time of uncertainty for many United Methodists. As some churches vote to leave the denomination, they are leaving behind members who wish to remain a United Methodist. To try to help these folks navigate these times, the West Ohio Conference has come up with the designation of North Star Congregations.

The North Star is the anchor of the northern sky. It can be a helpful light to those who are looking for purposeful direction. Historically, the North Star has always provided a beacon of hope in times of uncertainty. North Star Congregations are local churches in the West Ohio Conference that are prepared to welcome and care for anyone whose church has closed or disaffiliated. North Star Congregations are United Methodist faith communities that provide a haven of peace and grace.

At our Administrative Council meeting in May, the Council voted unanimously to become a North Star Congregation and in doing so committed First United Methodist Church to:

- 1. the mission of the United Methodist Church with no intentions of disaffiliating.
- 2, being a welcoming place for everyone to belong during a season of grief, transition, and uncertainty.
- 3. providing opportunities to engage in the ministries of worship, discipleship, and mission, without pressure.
- 4. connecting people with other North Star Congregations in the region if our church is not a good fit for them.

If you have questions about our denomination, the Administrative Council decision, or if you would like more information, please do not hesitate to ask me. In addition to Sundays, I am at the church on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays, and if those days are not good for you, I will be glad to set up a time to meet that works with your schedule.

Jesus said, "I am the light of the world." – John 8:12. May we let our light shine, too!

The UMC Gathering is working to renew their mission: "Through restorative justice, we strive to establish the kingdom of God for all who enter, here and now". #### Read the Bible in a Year - Reading Schedule for June


This month we will finish up the book of Psalms, read all of the way through Proverbs, Ecclesiastes, and the Song of Solomon, leaving us ready to start Isaiah in July. You will notice the difference in the feel of the passages – moving from the poetry of the Psalms to the wisdom of Proverbs (where we slow our pace to better absorb the nuggets of knowledge), to the memoir format of Ecclesiastes, and then the love poetry of Song of Solomon. At the end of this month we will be halfway through the Bible. Great job everyone – keep up the good work!
