#### "Hispanic Heritage Month"

This month, we will celebrate National Hispanic Heritage Month.

We recognize and honor the Hispanic Heritage and its contribution
to this country in this celebration. So because of this important date, we would like to
share some fun facts about the Hispanic population in the United States. Are you ready?

Did you know that the Hispanic population in the U.S. is about 62.6 million people? That is 18.9% of the total population in this country. The Hispanic population is the largest racial minority in the U.S.

There are 13 states that host 1 million or more Hispanic residents within them. Those states are Arizona, California, North Carolina, Colorado, Florida, Georgia, Illinois, New Jersey, New Mexico, New York, Pennsylvania, Texas, and Washington. That is so amazing.

Riverside County in California registered the highest number of new Hispanic residents within 2020-2021. Almost 34,289 new Hispanic residents in a year. Can you imagine how these numbers have grown these last two years?

The average age within the Hispanic population is about 30 years old.

Including native-born and foreign-born populations, the Hispanic people come from these countries: Honduras, El Salvador, Mexico, Guatemala, Chile, Costa Rica, and Nicaragua.\* A growing number of people are coming from the Dominican Republic and Puerto Rico as well.

As we can see, the Hispanic population is a big part of this country. So this is a great time and it is such a good chance to celebrate and recognize their contribution to American society.

This month, we are planning some fun activities to celebrate our Hispanic ministries. There will be a time to play together "Loteria" (is kind of bingo game), and there will be a time to share together eating Hispanic food (see page 5). I am sure that we will have a wonderful time as a "Familia".
