#### From the Pastor

Dear Friends,

When I was a child, my family would travel to visit my aunt and uncle who lived in Missouri. We grew excited when we could see the St. Louis Arch – it was a sign we were almost there! As soon as my parents spotted it, they would point it out to me. And as the family legend goes, during one trip, my parents spotted it and were trying to point it out to me as we drove, but I couldn't see it. In frustration and defeat, I declared, "My eyes are too little!"

My family will still joke about this. Every year when we travel to see my aunt, as an experienced driver of this route, I know when to start looking and where to look. I am usually the first one to see the Arch. And each trip I declare in victory: "There is the Arch! My eyes are no longer little!"

I have been thinking about little eyes as I have been preparing for our new worship series that begins this month. We will explore stories that we associate with childhood like Jonah and Zacchaeus. This time, though, we will explore them as adults, listening for what new lesson God may be teaching us now. These are great stories that have things to teach us throughout our life, it would be sad to leave them as only childhood memories, to only have learned them with little eyes.

Like a potter at a wheel, God is seeking to form and shape us. As long as we have breath, God calls us to a life of learning and transformation. The Living Word invites us to let God's word live and move through us, changing us each day. The Spirit is always moving and calling us to move too. I hope you will join us, in person or online, as we look back at beloved Bible stories from our childhood and listen for how God is moving us forward.



#### IMPROVED TECH COMES TO FELLOWSHIP HALL



If you were in attendance at the Friday night presentation of MAD Camp, you may have noticed the stage was brighter and the sound was better than any other event in Fellowship Hall in recent years.

Earlier this year, about the time we started thinking about upgrading our sound/lights in Fellowship Hall due to the success for last year's MAD Camp and the Community Lenten Lunches, Middletown Lyric Theatre was vacating their former theater location and was moving to the Sorg Opera House where there was already a sound and light system in place. MLT Sound and Lighting Designer Edwin Toy spent some time assessing our existing system and seeing if the theater could provide some used equipment to update our own. We were able to work with Edwin Toy and Charley Shafor, Managing Artistic Director of the theater group, to install some of their unneeded equipment to "test it out" to see what would help our experience in Fellowship Hall. After passing the test, we were happy to purchase that equipment from them. Some of our existing equipment was able to be integrated with the theater equipment. So now we have 2 additional stage lights that will help wash stage with even lighting. Our sound improvement include 3 wireless body mics, and updated power amp and pole speakers on each side of the room.

We will purchase a Bluetooth system that will allow presenters to use their phones or laptops wirelessly. We are grateful to the Middletown Lyric Theater for donating the labor to install and design our new system and to the Memorial Committee for purchasing the equipment we needed to make these improvements.
