From the Pastor

Dear Friends,

I love making connections in worship. I do this by using a phrase from the closing hymn in a call to worship, using the same hymn or prayer during a worship series, or using a phrase throughout a season to emphasize a theme. Sometimes though, I am surprised when an unintentional connection is discovered. It has happened during this worship series where we are encouraged to Take Another Look at beloved Bible stories. We started this series with Moses and then re-visited the story of Noah. The Hebrew word translated ark is used in both stories. For Moses, ark was the word used for the basket his mother put him in. For Noah, it is the ship he makes. From Noah we went to Jonah and there is a connection between those two stories. Jonah's name in Hebrew means 'dove', which is the bird that Noah used to discover the land was drying. I love connections!

There are lots of opportunities for us to make connections in our life together. We are asking for folks to write holiday cards to our church members who cannot be physically present in worship (see article on pg. 3). Stewardship Sunday is coming up on the last Sunday of October and part of our commitment is connecting to ministries (see article on pg. 4).

Even more connection opportunities are available to us. You can join others in daily devotions in 2026 (see article on pg. 2). You can connect with others in worship. World Communion Sunday is October 5th and we begin a new worship series on October 12th (see article on pg. 2). And at the end of October we are going to be having an outdoor service in the afternoon where folks are invited to bring their pets for a Blessing of the Animals (see article on pg. 5). Even if you don't have a pet, you are welcome to come and join in an outdoor service.

I hope to connect with you in one or more of these ways this fall!

Great Is Thy Faithfulness

We begin a new worship series in October that will take us all the way through our observance of All Saints Day. Based on the hymn by the same title, this series will challenge our "If only I had more..." thoughts. Do you have those? If only I had more time.... If only I had more money.... If only I was more organized.... Are any of these familiar to you? Do you have some you could add to the list?

Although they may seem harmless, there is a danger to these little "If only" statements. They can begin to sow seeds of discontent and cause us to focus more on what we lack rather than the abundance of what we have. Great Is Thy Faithfulness, the beloved hymn, provides the framework for this series. Whenever we sing it, we sing so strong that the conviction of our faith rises clearly. To sing, "All I have needed, thy hand hath provided" is a statement that challenges whatever "If only" thoughts we may carry and encourages us to see the blessings that abound!

Join us in worship – either in person or online – as we celebrate the goodness of God whose hand has supplied all we have needed!

2026 Disciplines Devotional

We had such a great response to our Disciplines Daily Devotional that we are offering it again for 2026! Join other church members in a daily devotional time that will help you deepen your relationship with Christ. Each week the devotional offers a theme, a weekly overview, and questions that guide the daily devotions. Then each day a scripture reading, prayer, and reflection is offered. While the devotional is designed for individual use, other members of your church family will be using the same devotional resource so we will be sharing in the same journey. Both large print and regular print samples are available in the Commons as well as an order sheet. Cost is \$18 for regular and \$20 for large print.

Church Conference Tuesday, October 21st

Our annual Church Conference will be held on Tuesday, Oct. 21st starting at 6 pm. It is open to all in the church. This meeting is where you can get an update on church business as well as elect new officers, set goals, and set Pastoral salaries. It usually only takes 45 min to an hour. Everyone has a voice and a place at the table. However, only members are allowed to vote.



While planning the upcoming sermon series "Great Is Thy Faithfulness", couldn't help but keep in mind the text to the hymn of the same name. My favorite part of the hymn is how, in the refrain, the melody rises with the words "all I have needed" the returns down the scale with "thy hand hath provided". When I play it for hymn singing, you will notice I separate those notes a little for emphasis as we sing "all I have needed". It's something that I need to constantly remember. It's all I have NEEDED, not all I have WANTED. It is a humbling thought and yet one filled with gratefulness.

Each Sunday, during this series, the tune will appear somewhere in the service. Often, with a familiar and beloved hymn, we listen or sing through our memories of what this hymn means to us-hearing our parents sing it as we sat next to them in church, a recording of a favorite vocalist, or as a part of a Memorial service of a loved one. During the series, I urge you to read through the text as you hear it being played. Read the text with fresh eyes, as if you are discovering it for the first time and maybe even write out the verses so you can see it as poetry. And while all of Pastor Kim's messages are not directly tied to the text of this hymn, you will find that it magnifies the message. It's #140 in our United Methodist Hymnal. I look forward to sharing this wonderful series in music and song with you in October!
